These days the fall season is a really busy period for NGRA. After a successful BigHorn Rodeo 2008, yours truly packed his bags and headed off the IGRA Finals in Denver where I served as Asst. Rodeo Director (cow) and Mitch Gill served as Asst. Rodeo Director (non-cow). Our own Lorry King served as Asst. Secretary and Tom Coleman as a Timer. Also attending Finals was a large contingent of NGRA members including Bill Trunzo, Randy Meadows, Jason Dwyer, Colin Moulton who all volunteered and contestant Steve Minyard. NGRA had four contestants invited to Final including Richard Armstrong, Chris Due, Dustin Monk and Steve Minyard. The event ran smoothly and everyone had a blast in spite of the nasty weather.

Last week a bunch of us headed off to New Orleans for the 24<sup>th</sup> Annual IGRA Convention. Our delegation included me as Trustee, Delegate, Rodeo Resources and University Chair, Benjamin Avant as Bylaws Chair, Shaun Sewell as delegate and PR & Marketing Chair. Our other delegates and alternates were Lorry King, Bill Trunzo, Bill Watkins, Eddy Krien, Colin Moulton and Jeffrey Neal (Asst. Bylaws & University Chair). Mitch G was present representing another association.

On Thursday, I attended the IGRA Executive Board meeting, the Board meeting, the Trustee's meeting and an Ethical Practices Review Board meeting. That was just the start of meetings. On Friday your delegation spent the whole day attending committee meetings where proposals are crafted and reviewed for presentation to the General Assembly on Saturday and Sunday. Friday early evening we all went to cheer on our very own Katrina in the IGRA Royalty Competition. Katrina never looked or performed better and we were all so proud to call her one of our own. The competition was fierce and all of the candidates all had very high scores. After all the points were tallied, the IGRA Royalty Team for 2009 is:

Friday night we all went out to Bourbon Street to marvel at the Halloween Night madness. I'll leave reporting on our social activities and the craziness of the French Quarter to others, if they dare.

The convention sessions ran from 9am to around 5pm

both days and we managed to get an amazing amount of work done, especially work on revising the Rodeo Rules. A brief summary of actions:

- The entire Rodeo Rules section was reorganized into more user-friendly sections including new sections on "Association" and "Contestant" responsibilities.
- We passed a rule change allocating \$4 of World Finals Rodeo contestant fees to the production of finals; this will help fund the event now that IGRA is producing it instead of various host associations.
- We passed several rules changes intended to make various events run more quickly, including the "Lorry King" rule change where team ropers may only one once as either a header or heeler.
- We added a new section to Rodeo Resources teaching the technical details of desirable Arena Conditions.
- We added a list of required safety equipment for Rough Stock contestants.
- For animal safety we added a requirement that the return gates have a white banner on them at least ½ their height. Also the back gate will now be open during Calf Roping on Foot.
- We eliminated the twice yearly contestant mailings.
- Running Orders will now be posted for the public to see.
- A portion raised by IGRA Royalty contestants that was earmarked for IGRA will now go to their travel fund.
- I proposed "Ribbon Roping" as our first new event in over 20 years and it passed.

In other business, I was re-elected to sit on the IGRA Executive Board as Division One Trustee Chair, so I will be able to represent NGRA's interests at the top levels of IGRA.

Finally, as Trustee I want to proudly congratulate two of our members who were honored with awards on Sunday. Lorry King was awarded the "Directors Award" for her years of service to IGRA and Bill Watkins was awarded the coveted "President's Award" for his contributions to IGRA in graphic design over the years. In addition I received an award for my work on Finals and University and we brought home two "Appreciation Awards" for SNAPI and Hawks/Rack/Onyx for their support of gay rodeo. Those will be publicly presented soon. Now it's time to rest.
