February was such a busy month and it seems like it was almost over before it got started! NGRA had a large presence at RoadRunner Regional Rodeo in Phoenix over President's Day Weekend. Unfortunately, the weather was not very cooperative and had a huge impact on this year's crowd because of the high winds and rain. Despite the weather, a great time was had by all! I always have a lot of fun spending time with my fellow Men of Charlie's from Las Vegas, Phoenix, Denver and Chicago.

There was a little confusion about the new Rodeo Review Procedures, which replaced the protest process because many contestants were unaware of certain rule changes. It is my goal to share this information at meetings, and in the newsletter, so everyone is kept in the loop and there are no surprises. The Rodeo Rules and changes are available in the IGRA website before each rodeo year begins for those who may not know this already. One issue that came up resulted in a Trustee interpretation until the next IGRA Board of Director's Meeting in Ft. Lauderdale in April. There was a Rodeo Review requested from a contestant who pierced a bucket prior to sticking the flag in Flag Racing. The Pattern Judge was unable to see this, and another Judge made the Pattern Judge aware of this disqualifying factor. It was questioned whether or not an "Off-Duty" Judge could share information with other judges to assist in their call. The Trustees' interpretation was that judges are considered to be judges for the entire rodeo and are not limited to only the events they are assigned to. Furthermore, it was decided that judges work as a team regardless of the events they are assigned to.

NGRA had two contestants representing us in Phoenix: Richard Armstrong and Chris Due, who brought home several ribbons between the two of them. (Their results for the weekend are below) Way to go, Guys!

The next rodeo coming up is The Traditional Texas Rodeo the second weekend in March. Laura Scott will be representing NGRA on my behalf because it is not one of the rodeos on my busy rodeo calendar this year. I hope everyone who is going and/or competing has a safe, fun trip! Beginning March 2nd, the BigHorn Rodeo Planning Committee will meet every other week on Wednesdays at 6:30 PM at The Center. To make BigHorn 14 a huge success, we need as many members to get involved in the planning and/or volunteer. The Fundraising Committee has been working feverishly to raise as much money as they can to fund our rodeo and my hat is off to all of them! Please come out and see what exciting plans are in the works and get involved if you are able. Until next time, be good... or be good at it! Let's Rodeo!!
