

Membership information

Membership in the Nevada Gay Rodeo Association is open to individuals 18 and over. All memberships include a membership pin, name badge, ID card, subscription to the BigHorn Gazette, one vote privilege and eligibility to compete in any IGRA sanctioned event.

INDIVIDUAL MEMBERSHIP 21 YEARS AND OLDER

There is a one time initiation fee of \$25 while dues are current and renewed timely. In addition, Annual dues are \$24 per calendar year, prorated if joining after January at a rate of \$2 per month (starting with the month after dues are paid) through December of the same calendar year. For example, if you join on April 5, you would pay \$16 (\$2 per month from May to December) plus the \$25 initiation fee for a total of \$41.

The renewed membership fees before January 31, 2009 is \$24.00 (\$2.00 X 12 months). The membership fees paid after January 31, 2009 but before February 28, 2009 is \$34.00 (\$24.00 plus a late fee of \$10.00). After February members are removed to an inactive list. To Become a member after February the fee is \$45.00. (\$25.00 initiation fee and \$20.00, 10 months X \$2.00). *There is a \$10.. fee for check that bounce.*

INDIVIDUAL MEMBERSHIP UNDER 21 YEARS OLD

For members under 21 years of age, the initiation fee and annual dues are one half the above listed amounts.

CORPORATE MEMBERSHIP and SPONSORSHIPS

It all started with cowboys who would show off their riding and stock handling skills at informal get-togethers. Today, it's one of the fastest growing and most exciting spectator sports in the country.

But there is much more than "sport" to rodeo and the Nevada Gay Rodeo Association (NGRA). There's friendship and camaraderie, fundraising for worthy charities, and a chance to be a part of a social organization committed to bringing the gay and lesbian community closer together.

NGRA was founded in Las Vegas in February of 1992 by a handful of Country Western fans. Since then, membership and recognition have grown quickly. This includes being fully sanctioned by the International Gay Rodeo Association (IGRA).

The two major goals of all rodeo associations are to produce rodeos and raise money for charitable organizations. NGRA has produced the annual BigHorn Rodeo since 1996. While a rodeo is great fun, it also requires the support and commitment of our members to carry out the hard work of producing a rodeo.

That's where you come in! When you join NGRA you become a member of an organization committed to making a rodeo happen. Your membership dues, as well as your efforts, will go towards this goal. The Rodeo Planning Committee is the place to be for full involvement in helping produce our rodeos.

Rodeo? But I've never even been on a horse?

Rodeo is a sport that relies not only on its contestants but on its fans too. It's fast, exciting, and addictive. NGRA will keep you posted on when and where rodeos are being held and fellow members can help you make plans to attend.

Still, I don't know if I want to plan my life around weekends watching goat dressing!

There's much more to gay rodeos than goat dressing (a "camp" event unique to gay rodeo). As well as regular horse and steer events, rodeos usually feature a wide variety of entertainment during the day including dancing, drag performances, live performers and more. There are vendors selling a wide range of products and lots of great people to meet and mingle with. At night, there are dances and parties. Plus, local bars are packed with fellow rodeo goers.

What else does the NGRA do?

Throughout the year the NGRA Fundraising Committee plans fundraising events. But, it's the members who make the events work. We need a lot of help with everything from ideas and organization to volunteers in order to make the event a success. Regular events include monthly beer busts entertainment shows, and the annual NGRA Royalty Pageant. Recent special events include cookouts, charity poker tournaments, and rodeo play days. NGRA works closely with other local organizations including the Imperial Royal Sovereign Court of the Desert Empire Inc, and The Sin City Sisters.

The word "fundraising" seems to come up a lot.

And for good reason! Almost all of our events are geared toward raising money for our rodeos, which can easily cost \$80,000 to produce. Of course, with skillful planning and plenty of help, a rodeo can make a profit. A portion of the profits from BigHorn Rodeo are reinvested as seed money for the following year's rodeo. The remainder is donated to charitable organizations throughout Nevada and the United States.

Do I have to live in Las Vegas to join?

No, you can live anywhere in the world! Our members are primarily from Las Vegas, but we have members who reside throughout North America.

NGRA's Leadership

NGRA relies upon all its members to function efficiently, but it is the officers and other members of the Board of Directors who help set the direction and provide leadership. NGRA's Board of Directors are elected annually in April. We also hold an annual state convention where all members can be involved in creating and modifying our bylaws.

NGRA's Royalty

NGRA also selects Royalty each year to represent the organization at a variety of functions at the local and international level. Contestants compete for the titles of Mr. NGRA, Ms. NGRA, Miss NGRA (female impersonator) and MsTER NGRA. The Royalty also work to raise funds for the association and local charities.

The International Gay Rodeo Association is the organizational and sanctioning body for gay rodeos. It is made up of over twenty member associations throughout the United States and Canada. IGRA sanctions over twenty rodeos each year. Events are Bull Riding, Team Roping, Bareback Bronc Riding, Chute Dogging, Steer Riding, Breakaway Calf Roping, Pole Bending, Calf Roping on Foot, Flag Race, Barrel Race, Steer Decorating, Goat Dressing and Wild Drag Race.
